For the last 30 years, Denver voters have periodically approved the issuance of General Obligation bonds to fix, repair and improve essential infrastructure, facilities and assets.

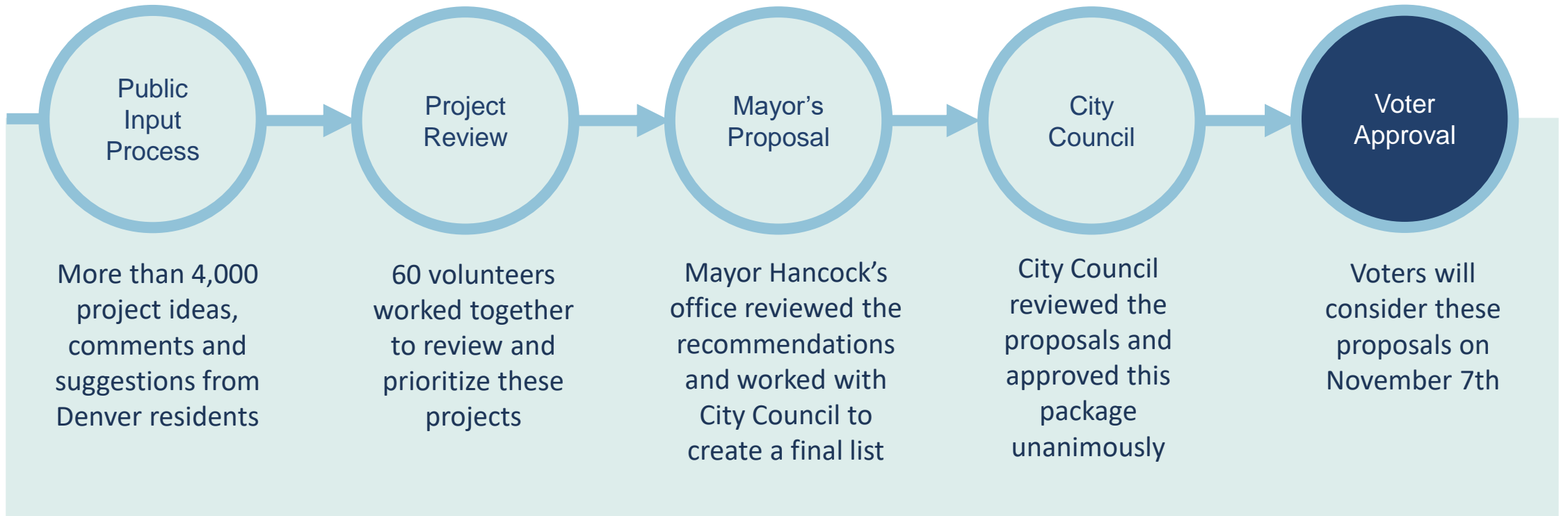

Yes on 2A: Transportation

Street Repaving



Our Denver Bond will fund repaving of 287 miles of high-traffic streets and curb and gutter repair and replacement

Connecting our transportation network



Our Denver Bonds will connect our bike, pedestrian and transit infrastructure to make it an easier and safer way to get around town

Bridge Replacement and Reconstruction



Nine bridges will be replaced or repaired, including the 88-year-old 8th Avenue Bridge over the South Platte and the 61-year-old 14th Avenue Bridge over Cherry Creek

Creating new transportation options



Bus rapid transit along Colfax Avenue will reduce congestion along one of our busiest streets



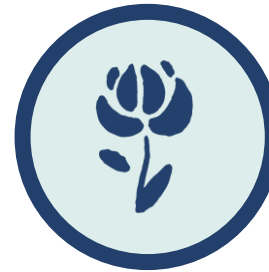
Yes on 2B: Museums, Zoo and Theatres

Yes on 2E: Libraries



Improving and modernizing Libraries

Addressing significant infrastructure challenges and modernizing facilities to include community spaces, technology labs and new learning areas for children



Yes on 2F: Parks and Rec

Westwood Rec Center



Building a new regional recreation center in the Westwood neighborhood, including a gym, fitness areas, swimming pool and community rooms

Park and Rec Center Improvements



Critical maintenance and facility improvements at 21 rec centers and 47 neighborhood parks



Yes on 2G: City Facility Repairs

Accessibility Improvements

Denver is leading the charge to eliminate physical and communication barriers that prevent people from participating in the community. Our Denver Bonds will help make Denver's public buildings more accessible to people with disabilities.

City Building Maintenance
