CDE's Role in the COVID-19 Response

1

Coordinate with the Governor's Office and other state agencies and provide the public with simple, accurate and timely information that will save lives.

2

Support schools, districts and families with clear guidance on safety and remote learning.

3

Make immediate decisions on necessary changes to education policy, and advise the Governor, Legislature, State Board on more long-term changes that may be needed.

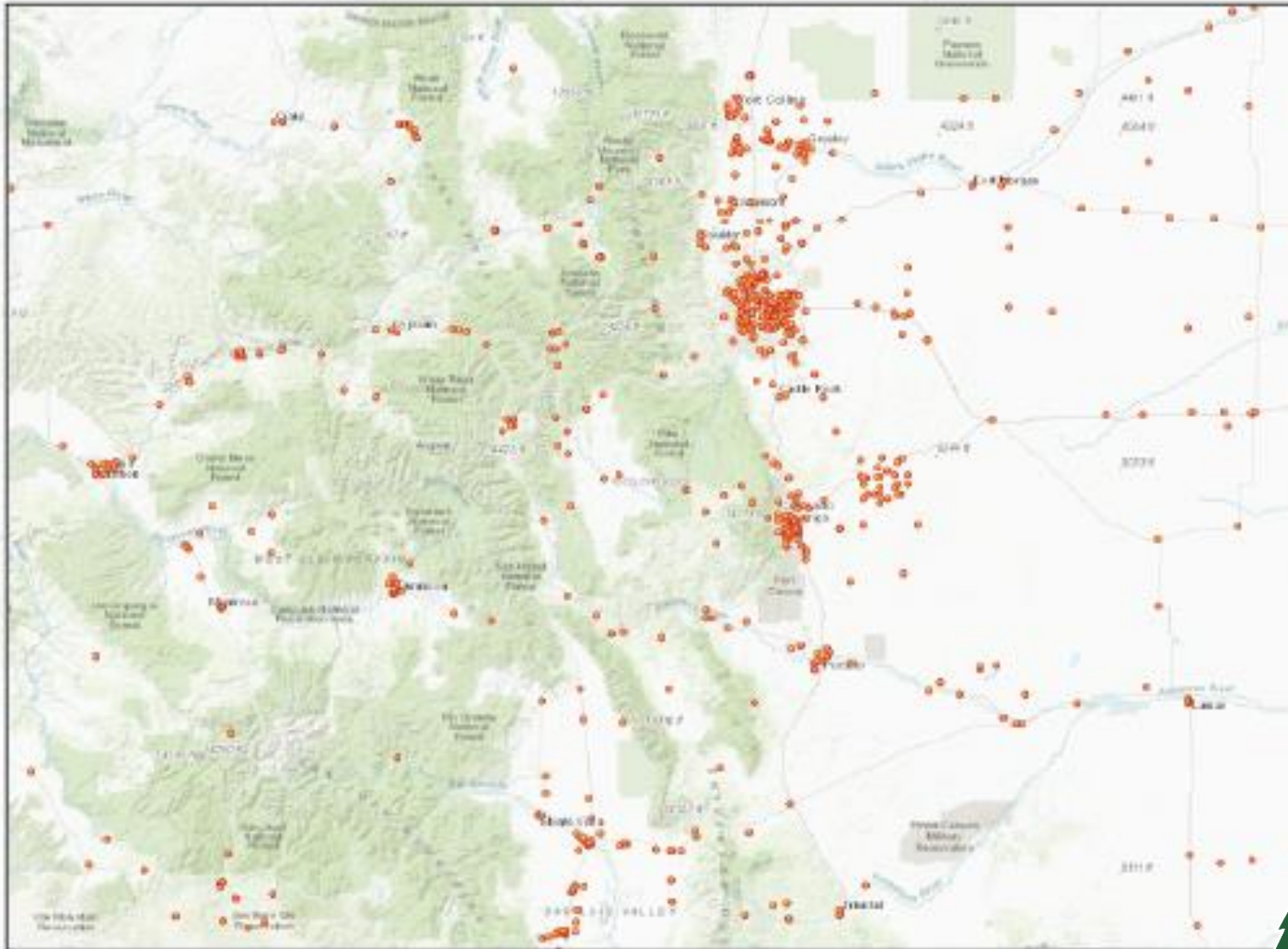
